Lucky Vega to close out racing career at Royal Ascot

Yulong to retire Group 1-winning son of Lope De Vega after St James's Palace Stakes ahead of standing at Victoria stud

uropean Group 1-winning twoyear-old Lucky Vega (Lope De Vega) will end his brief yet successful race career in the St James's Palace Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) at Royal Ascot tonight (Australian time).

Yulong Stud owner Yuesheng Zhang will resist the temptation to extend the three-year-old's career beyond an eighth start and instead stick to the plan of bringing the son of Lope De Vega (Shamardal) to his Victorian stallion operation in August ahead of the 2021 breeding season.

One of six stallions on the Yulong roster, led by Written Tycoon (Iglesia), Lucky Vega will stand for an introductory fee of \$22,000 (inc GST).

Troy Stephens, Yulong's nominations and sales manager, yesterday confirmed that the Jessica Harrington-trained Lucky Vega would be retired after the St James's Palace Stakes on the opening day of the Royal Meeting.

"It was definitely a hard decision to make and there was a lot of talk around it, but we want to be a premier stallion farm and we want to stand champion stallions, so the decision to bring him down (this year) was pretty easy when we look at it that way," Stephens said.

and we think he's going to be a really good chance (of making it as a stallion)."

The Jim Bolger-trained Poetic Flare (Dawn Approach) is the 4-1 favourite for the St James's Palace Stakes after finishing runner-up to stablemate Mac Swiney (New Approach) in the Irish 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m) at the Curragh.

Lucky Vega, on the fifth line of betting as a 13-2 chance, ran fourth in the Irish 2,000 Guineas while also finishing third at his previous start to Poetic Flare in the 2,000 Guineas Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) at Newmarket on May 1, his first start as a three-year-old.

Stephens would not dismiss the prospect of Lucky Vega bowing out as a dual Group 1 winner after tonight's Group 1 race.

"He came back as a three-year-old first-up in the 2,000 Guineas at Newmarket where he ran a very courageous third, beaten by a short margin. He then went to the Irish Guineas where he absolutely hated the track," he said.

"It was blowing a gale and bucketing down with rain over there, but he held on for a strong fourth, so they are really happy going into (tonight's) run.

"I think if he can go back to producing what he did at Newmarket he will be very hard to beat."

<< Continued from page 2 Shadwell's Mostahdaf (Frankel), who won the Heron Stakes (Listed, 1m) at Sandown on May 20, is second favourite at 5-1 for trainers John and Thady Gosden while Aidan O'Brien and Ryan Moore have the third elect in Battleground (War Front) at 11-2.

The early reaction to Lucky Vega from Australian breeders has been positive with Stephens suggesting it was hard to ignore the southern hemisphere feats of his own sire Lope De Vega (Shamardal) during a four-year shuttling stint between 2011 and 2014.

year-olds, and he is out of a Danehill mare himself.

"He is going to be the first son of Lope De Vega to stand at stud in Australia, which is a huge thing, and breeders are pretty eager to see him and his bookings are certainly going well, so we couldn't be happier with him."

Lucky Vega won his first start as a juvenile at Naas last June before finishing runner-up in the Railway Stakes (Gr 2, 6f) at the Curragh. He then went one

better at the same Ireland course, landing the prestigious Phoenix Stakes (Gr 1, 6f) in August. He was also runner-up to Supremacy (Mehmas) in the Middle Park Stakes (Gr 1, 6f) at Newmarket in September to round out his season.

Yulong is also launching the stud careers of Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Tagaloa (Lord Kanaloa) and Cantala Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Yulong Prince (Gimmethegreenlight) this year at their Nagambie stud in Victoria.

Kinane ready to resume

Having spent time with champion trainer Chris Waller, Kinane (Reliable Man) is back with his original conditioner and is set to make his racing return at Flemington on Saturday. Michael Kent has the four-year-old entered for the Brian Beattie Handicap (1420m) and The David Bourke (1600m) on Saturday in a low-key build up to a potential spring campaign. Last year's Frank Packer Plate (Gr 3, 2000m) winner had one start for Kent, who also has a share in the gelding, back in October 2019 before he was transferred to Waller. He had his last run for Waller when finishing 13th in the Naturalism Stakes (Gr 3, 2000m) last September. "He's coming along well and I'll probably run him at Flemington on Saturday, I'm not sure which race yet, over seven furlongs or a mile," Kent told RSN. "He's had some issues but he seems to be coping well with them at the moment. You won't see the best of him until he gets to a trip but he's had a really good break, he's matured up. He had some bone bruising and that seems to have settled down. We'll keep him at Flemington on a good surface, give him a couple of runs and if he shows some form that warrants it, we can freshen him up and get him ready for the spring."

Ryan brings Qld duo home

Sircconi (Nicconi) and Mahamedeis (Magnus) have returned to Nick Ryan's Flemington base after failing to fire in Queensland. Sircconi finished 14th in the BRC Sprint (Gr 3, 1350m) and Mahamedeis ran ninth in the Premier's Cup (Gr 3, 2400m), and with the lack of rain in Queensland Ryan decided to cut short their campaigns.

"I thought we would just get them home, there's plenty of races for them down here," Ryan told Racing.com. "We could have sat around until Ipswich but that wasn't for another two weeks. Sircconi copped a firm track and didn't go a yard. Mahamedeis was in a slowly run race and pulled hard." On their future targets, Ryan added: "Sircconi can go to the Winter Championship heat next week and press onto the final. There's the VOBIS Gold stayers race for Mahamedeis that he won last year, or he can even go and get his hurdle ticket and head to a maiden hurdle if we wanted to go down that path."

Front Page to step up workload

Front Page (Magnus) is being lined up for another shot at The Kosciuszko (1200m) in October after missing the contest through a freak incident last year. Front Page landed the A R Creswick Stakes (Listed, 1200m) 12 months ago ahead of The Kosciuszko, but had to be withdrawn from the rich countryrestricted race after getting injured in a float mishap on the way to Sydney for the race. He is now back in the stables of Geoff Duryea and ready to step up his work. "He's on the back of the float as we speak and I am taking home to start trackwork after he's had a few weeks on the treadmill and water walker," Duryea told Racing.com. "It'll be great to see him back. He's ready to go and I can't wait. It was breaking my heart when I'd walk past looking at him in the paddock."

Darceandermill lands prize at Mornington

Darceandermill (Lonhro) scored his second win from three starts when landing the Ron Hutchinson Handicap (1200m) at Mornington yesterday. Having been scratched from the Clanbrooke Racing Handicap (100m) at Sandown on Saturday in preference of this, the Jason Warren-trained Darceandermill defeated favourite Beagle (Pride Of Dubai) by three-quarters of a length at a crowdless Mornington. "That's the second win for the boys and unfortunately they couldn't be here for it," Warren said. "We went out with a plan knowing we had the fittest horse in the race, or one of them. The 1200 metres on a heavy track here for two-year-olds is a pretty stiff ask, so we made sure we made good use of our fitness and him being a professional. I don't think 1200 is really his trip, but I felt that the way this race shaped he could get away with it, so now, anywhere between that 1000 metres and 1200 metres could suit. He has got a good future."

Promise Of Success impresses on Australian debut

The John O'Shea-trained Promise Of Success (Dansili) made an impressive start to life in Australia when notching a comfortable twolength success in the 1200-metre maiden handicap at Warwick Farm yesterday. Promise Of Success arrived from Britain winless from four starts but the \$2.35 favourite eased to victory yesterday ahead of Rebel Shadow (Rebel Dane). "Impressive Australian debut for Promise Of Success at Warwick Farm under Hugh Bowman," O'Shea said on Twitter. "A bright future awaits." The five-year-old, who had been off the track since May 2019 prior to yesterday's success, is out of a three-quarter sister to Galileo (Sadler's Wells).

The Empire reigns at Warwick Farm

Newly gelded three-year-old The Empire (Not A Single Doubt) continued his progression through the grades with a strong three-length success in the 1300-metre Benchmark 64 at Warwick Farm yesterday. Following up a win at Newcastle earlier in the month, The Empire, a \$210,000 Inglis Easter purchase, defeated Centimental (Snitzel) comfortably. "That was very good," winning trainer Gary Portelli said. "Scott Darby (Darby Racing) and the team bought him from the Easter Sales a year and a half ago. He was a well-bred colt, but unfortunately he needed gelding. Now he has come back and has won two of three. It goes to show you how you can improve these horses. Everyone wants to keep colts and you've got to make a decision about whether you want a racehorse. That decision has been made and here he is winning easily in town."

Three from four for Kibosh

The John Thompson-trained Kibosh (So You Think) made it three wins from her past four starts when scoring as odds-on favourite at Warwick Farm yesterday. The three-year-old filly faced her stiffest test to date when contesting the 1600-metre Benchmark 64 Handicap and impressed with a three-quarter-length success over the Matthew Dunn-trained Duchess Adele (Adelaide). "She got a little bit keen mid-race and was challenged around the corner, so there were a couple of little worrying things but she is just a lovely mare and gives you 110 per cent," Thompson said. "In the past she has been challenged in races and she really lifts and she did today, she really fought well."

Drama at Farm as jockey weighs in light

Promising apprentice Reece Jones was involved in a unique incident at Warwick Farm yesterday after weighing in light due to a fault from trainer Graham Brown. Jones, who rode a fourtimer at Randwick on Saturday, finished first past the post aboard Admit It (Zaha) in the Benchmark 72 Handicap over 2400 metres but was disqualified after weighing in 1.4 kilograms light. It turned out Brown left a lead-bag off and he was subsequently fined \$5,000. Brown Thomas (Lope De Vega), who finished second behind Admit It, was declared the winner.

Kiwi double for Doudle

Travis Doudle is developing quite a liking for New Zealand horses. The Morphettville trainer picked up a double at his home track on Saturday with New Zealand-sourced horses Jaguary (Niagara) and Not Usual Glorious (Fiorente), and an interstate trip could be on the cards for the pair of them as a result. "They both went really well," Doudle said. "Not Usual Glorious has got the hattrick now and Jaguary is going for one next start. I am very happy with both horses. Jaguary went off the boil there for a little while, but we worked pretty hard to get him back on track and he is certainly doing that now. It was a very confident run, he stretched to the line really nicely. I am pretty excited about where he is headed. I think Jaguary is Melbourne city class at his absolute peak, whether or not he goes there next start I am not sure yet. Maybe fresh into a Balaklava Cup or something like that could be an option for him early in the spring. He is a very nice horse and is definitely city class."

Refreshed Brown back in the saddle

Ethan Brown is back riding again after taking a break from the saddle. The 22-year-old jockey, who hasn't ridden competitively since February, took a break from riding in 2019 and did the same thing again this year, in an attempt to freshen up his body and mind. "I'm back into the swing of things," Brown told Racing.com. "I've been riding work every morning and I'm very fit at

the moment. I had a little let-up there, I got a bit heavy, I got suspended and I got a bit sour on it so I had a little rest. I was never pulling the pin, it was the same deal as last time, I just needed some space. I'm refreshed and ready to go again."

Payne also makes return

Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m)-winning jockey Michelle Payne will also return to the saddle at Sandown on Wednesday after taking a break since the Warrnambool carnival. The duallicense holder has only had 11 rides this year and is beginning to prepare for the future. "I haven't had many runners and it's just too hard to ride all year around," Payne told Racing. com. "So I thought I would take a little break. I've been keeping fit, but it was just a good time to have a break especially now as I've got a few more runners coming up. I am trying to take a step back and put other riders on because I want to learn to hand the reins over. At some point I am going to have to retire."

Hefel discharged from hospital after fall

In-form apprentice Carlene Hefel has escaped serious injury in a fall at Edenhope but will require a minimum 12-day stand-down under Racing Victoria's concussion policy. Hefel fell from Pres De Toi (Helmet) in the Apsley Cup (2000m) on Sunday, a day after completing her second metropolitan double at Sandown. Hefel, who now has 16 metropolitan winners to her name, including nine in Perth, was discharged from the local hospital on Monday to make her way back to Melbourne. "I've felt better than I'm feeling this morning," Hefel told RSN. "I'm a bit bruised and battered, but very, very lucky. I've got the 12-day concussion rule so I'll be out for 12 days minimum but hopefully back for Saturday week. I'll have to rest up but I'll be working behind the scenes towards the end of next week, keeping myself fit."

Rogerson makes most of Island holiday

Graeme Rogerson has spent a week at the Chatham Islands, which is 800 kilometres east of New Zealand's two main Islands, with former top jockey Jimmy Cassidy, and their wives. "Anybody who hasn't been there should go there," Rogerson said. "We just went over and had a chat at the pub, Hotel Chathams, and met the local people. A few Chatham Islanders bought shares in some horses as well." Rogerson has returned in time to watch a handful of his team, which he trains in partnership with his wife Debbie, race on Cambridge's synthetic track on Wednesday. Well-bred four-year-old Alegre (Pins) will be vying for back-to-back wins in the NZB Pearl Insurance Race (1550m) after winning over the same course and distance a fortnight ago. "She is a lovely mare who has just taken time," Rogerson said of the daughter of his former Group 1 winner Soriano (Savabeel). "I thought she would win the other day and everyone in the world backed her. It's a Pearl Series race, otherwise she would be racing in the mile and a quarter, but she will run really

Waddell banned for ten years

Multiple Group 1-winning rider Jason Waddell has been handed a ten-year ban from racing after threatening to kill a racing official and posting an insulting message about another person via social media, who he also

threatened by phone. A committee from the Judicial Control Authority found that 35-year-old Waddell said to the official: "You're dead, watch your back." The disqualification runs from September 2020 to September 2030 and is concurrent with Waddell's disqualification of 22 months imposed by another judicial committee in December 2020 on a charge Waddell failed to provide a urine sample for analysis, for which he pleaded guilty to in November 2020.

UK: Waterhouse and Bott on a Mission at Goffs London

Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott are set to train Military Mission (Mastercraftsman) after purchasing the northern hemisphere three-year-old from the Goffs London Sale yesterday. From the Kremlin Cottage draft, the son of Mastercraftsman (Danehill Dancer) was bought for £170,000 (approx. AU\$310,800) in conjunction with McKeever Bloodstock. "I've always bought a few with Adrian and Gai and over the years we've bought some good ones together, including Knights Order who won the Brisbane Cup at the weekend," said Johnny McKeever. "Their team was keen to find another young horse to bring down and when I saw Military Mission at Hugo Palmer's last week and liked him a lot. He's by Mastercraftsman, who's the same sire of Paths Of Glory who's done very well in Australia having also been trained by Hugo Palmer. I spoke to Gai and Adrian and we agreed on a price and said we'd have a go at getting him. I think he was well enough bought for the money he's cost so I'm very happy." Currently trained by Hugo Palmer, the gelding, who has won once and placed on four other occasions from six starts, finished runner-up in the nationalracehorseweek.uk Handicap 2½f) at Chester last month. He is entered in the King George V Stakes (1m 4f) at Royal Ascot on Thursday and the Golden Gates Stakes (1m 2f) on Saturday. "I'm waiting to hear back from Gai and Adrian as to whether they want to have a go in the Duke of Edinburgh on Thursday, but if he's fit and ready then why not. After that he'll get ready for quarantine and probably fly out on the flight that leaves just after the July Sale." Military Mission is the second foal out of winning German-bred mare Atlantic Isle (Tamayuz), who is a half-sister to the Group 3-placed Atlantic High (Nashwan).

UK: Zinc White bought for £310,000

Of the 11 horses offered at Goffs London yesterday, two others sold, including Zinc White (Vadamos) for £310,000 (approx. AU\$566,600). Consigned by Kimpton Down Stables, two-time winner Zinc White, who has been declared for the Queen's Vase (Gr 2, 1m 6f) tomorrow, was purchased by Dan Astbury and Oliver Greenall. Zinc White is out of Group 1-winning mare Chinese White (Dalakhani), who has so far produced five winners from as many runners, the best of which is the Listedplaced Misty Grey (Dark Angel). Unbeaten two-year-old Tipperary Sunset (Ardad) was the other horse to sell. Declared for the Windsor Castle Stakes (Listed, 5f) tomorrow after wins at Hamilton and Beverley, Tipperary Sunset was bought by Mandore Int Agency for £200,000 (approx. AU\$365,550).

UK: Addeybb not declared for Prince of Wales's Stakes

Love (Galileo) and Lord North (Dubawi) remain on course for a fascinating clash in the Prince of Wales's Stakes (Gr 1, 1m 2f) at Royal Ascot tomorrow, although Addeybb (Pivotal) will not feature in the day-two highlight. A brilliant winner of last year's 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m) and Oaks (Gr 1, 1m 4f), Love is set to make a much-anticipated first start since winning the Yorkshire Oaks (Gr 1, 1m 4f) last August. Lord North was an impressive winner of the Prince of Wales's last year and returns to defend his crown on the back of a dominant success in the Dubai Turf (Gr 1, 1800m) at Meydan in March. Addeybb, winner of the Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) at Randwick in April, has shown a preference for a softer surface, and although thunderstorms are forecast at Ascot, they are not due to arrive until Wednesday evening. William Haggas said: "We've minded him so far in his career and are not going to run him on good to firm now at his age. It's going to rain at some time and it's just unfortunate. The next logical place is the Eclipse."

AUSSIES MAY BE ABSENT BUT ROYAL MEETING SURE TO EXERT GLOBAL INFLUENCE

or the second year in succession, and amidst the prevailing Coronavirus pandemic, there will be no Australian raiders to Royal Ascot for this week's five-day extravaganza, which will feature the pinnacle of European horseflesh.

Indeed, the last horse to head north was the Toby Edmonds-trained Houtzen (I Am Invincible) in the 2019 King's Stand Stakes (Gr 1, 5f), while a year previous the Diamond Jubilee (Gr 1, 6f) was won by Merchant Navy (Fastnet Rock). However, interest from southern hemisphere eyes will be no less diminished for this year's spectacle.

Whether we see the emergence of a potential contender for this year's spring carnival, a star breed-shaping shuttle stallion of the future, or a flagbearing two-year-old to launch the stud career of a first season sire, there is plenty to keeps tabs on across the five days.

First season shuttle stallions to the fore

We've witnessed something quite extraordinary in Australia this year with the exploits of this term's first season sires, and a look at the two-year-old features across the Royal Ascot week displays a plethora of firstcrop runners from stallions hoping to leave a lasting legacy in the southern hemisphere, with their first Australian and New Zealand twoyear-olds set to hit tracks later this year.

Although still early in the northern hemisphere season, the progeny of first season shuttle stallions have plenty to whet breeders' appetites this week, not least in today's Coventry Stakes (Gr 2, 6f), where The Acropolis, a son of Churchill (Galileo), sits on the second line of betting, while another son of Churchill, Golden War, and Gisburn, a son of Haunui Farm's Ribchester (Iffraaj), will be hoping to propel their sire's name up in lights.

Later in the week, the feared juvenile string of US trainer Wesley Ward will feature Twilight Gleaming, a daughter of National Defense (Invincible Spirit), who is favoured for tomorrow's Queen Mary Stakes (Gr 2, 5f), while explosive six-length debut winner Ruthlin (Ribchester) will bid for success in the Windsor Castle Stakes (Listed, 5f) later on the Wednesday card.

Caravaggio (Scat Daddy) currently leads the first season sire standings in Europe by earnings and the Coolmore shuttler has entries for Thursday's Norfolk Stakes (Gr 2, 5f) and Friday's Albany Stakes (Gr 3, 6f).

Sticking to today's Coventry Stakes, a race won by Caravaggio himself in 2016, and the leading five juveniles in the market are sired by shuttle stallions, with the only filly in the field, Kaufymaker, by former Spendthrift shuttle stallion Jimmy Creed (Distorted Humor), heading the 17 declarations at 5-1 for Wesley Ward.

Elsewhere, the pedigree of the Ralph Beckett-trained Angel Bleu (Dark Angel) will be somewhat familiar, with her dam Cercle De La Vie (Galileo) a daughter of Hveger (Danehill), in turn the dam of Swettenham Stud stallion Highland Reel (Galileo), Idaho (Galileo) and Cape Of Good Hope (Galileo), who won the Caulfield Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) in 2019 for Lindsay Park, as well as the Australian-bred VRC Oaks (Gr 1, 2500m) and Vinery Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) runner-up Valdemoro (Encosta De Lago).

St James's Palace to unearth shuttle stallion(s)?

Lucky Vega (Lope De Vega) is one St James's Palace Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) contender we know for certain that will be standing in the southern hemisphere this year and, as revealed in ANZ Bloodstock News today, he will be retired after today's swansong.

A look at the 2019 running of the race sees the first three finishers now shuttle to the southern hemisphere. Led home by Circus Maximus (Galileo), who will stand this year at Windsor Park Stud in New Zealand for \$20,000 (plus GST), second place King Of Comedy (Kingman) was recently announced to be Novara Park bound, where he will stand for \$7,000 (plus GST), while in Australia Too Darn Hot (Dubawi) has already spent one season at Darley's Kelvinside Stud in New South Wales at a fee of \$44,000.

Last year's runner-up Pinatubo (Shamardal) will also have his first taste of Australia this coming breeding season, while Churchill contested the 2017 running and runners up Toronado (High Chaparral) (2013) and Night Of Thunder (Dubawi) (2014) have exerted considerable influence in the southern hemisphere.

This year's renewal has no shortage of potential future shuttle contenders to join Lucky Vega, with successful bloodlines in Australia and New Zealand featured throughout the line up.

But, overwhelmingly, the depth of the pedigrees on show in today's feature race are those of stallion-making order.

Battleground (War Front), sitting on the second line of betting, is the first foal out of Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Found (Galileo), while although lesser fancied,



he David Menuisier-trained Blue Cup (Kendargent) will bid to announce himself as a possible southern hemisphere spring contender when tackling the Wolferton Stakes (Listed, 1m 2f) at Royal Ascot today.

Owned by Michael Watt, Gerry Ryan and Roy David, the five-year-old gelding impressed when landing the Cazoo Handicap (1m 2f) at Epsom on Oaks day earlier this month, winning by five and a half lengths under Oisin Murphy.

Blue Cup will aim to follow that up at his first attempt in stakes company today in the Wolferton, which is the sixth race on the card due off at 02:35 AEST.

The race has been won in recent years by subsequent Australian runners Addeybb (Pivotal) (2019), Snoano (Nayef) (2017), Sir Isaac Newton (Galileo) (2016), Contributer (High Chaparral) (2014), Forgotten Voice (Danehill Dancer) (2013) and Gatewood (Galileo) (2012), with Blue Cup, a winner of three of his 13 starts, aiming to join that honour roll under William Buick.

Bought for €95,000 from the 2017 Arqana Deauville October Yearling Sale, Blue Cup is the only winner out of Australianbred stakes-placed mare Hunter Forward (Galileo), who won at Pakenham in 2010 before being exported to Britain.

She was brought back to Australia in 2017 and has an unraced two-yearold by Siyouni (Pivotal) named Storm Hunter. She also has a weanling colt by Foxwedge (Fastnet Rock) and was served by Spendthrift shuttler Omaha Beach (War Front) last September.

Maximal (Galileo) is out of Joyeuse (Oasis Dream), a half-sister to Frankel (Galileo).

Mostahdaf, the unbeaten son of Frankel himself, is a half-sister to last season's Sun Chariot Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) winner Nazeef (Invincible Spirit).

Aussie connections can be found in Chindit (Wootton Bassett), through Sunday's Apsley Cup (2000m) winner Last Week (Tamayuz) at Edenhope, whose dam World Class (Galileo) is a daughter of Out West (Gone West), dam of champion three-year-old Motivator (Montjeu) as well as third dam to Chindit.

Moreover, the dam of the Charlie Appliebytrained La Barrosa (Lope De Vega) is a halfsister to 2016 Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) runner-up Scottish (Teofilo).

Battaash the one to beat again

The King's Stand Stakes (Gr 1, 5f) has an illustrious honour roll of Australian winners, but it has been the mercurial Battaash (Dark Angel) that finally saw his time arrive last year, having finished runner-up to Blue Point (Shamardal) in 2019 and 2018.

Among the challengers are four runners :

for former Woodside Park shuttler Cable Bay (Invincible Spirit), led by last month's Temple Stakes (Gr 2, 5f) winner Liberty Beach.

Elsewhere, Oxted (Mayson), who has suffered two shock defeats this campaign, is out of Choisir (Danehill Dancer) mare Charlotte Rosina, while Stone Of Destiny (Acclamation) is out of a half-sister to Artful Whisper (Machiavellian), who was sold for \$19,000 in Inglis Digital's April sale. She is the dam of prolific WA stakes winner Whispering Brook (Hinchinbrook), who won the Karrakatta Plate (Gr 2, 1200m), WA Gimcrack Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) and WA Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) in an unbeaten five-start juvenile campaign.

She sold to Katsumi Yoshida for \$1.1 million at the 2019 Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale, while Artful Whisper has a weanling filly by Russian Revolution (Snitzel).

Six-year-old Stone Of Destiny is the winner of four races in 31 starts and ran fourth in the Commonwealth Cup (Gr 1, 6f) at Royal Ascot in 2018.

Sir Busker seeks Ascot repeat

Sir Busker, a son of Cornerstone Stud shuttler Sir Prancealot (Tamayuz), will bid for a repeat of his Royal Ascot success 12 months ago when he takes on ten rivals in the opening Queen Anne Stakes (Gr 1, 1m), which features hot favourite Palace Pier (Kingman).

Sir Busker landed the Silver Royal Hunt Cup (1m) last year and has been winless since, but ran a good fourth in the Queen Elizabeth II Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) on British Champions Day in October last year.

The Ascot Stakes (2m 4f) will see Lostwithiel (Camelot) build on a promising record of two wins and two seconds from four starts, and further back in the four-year-old's pedigree you'll find Myer Classic (Gr 1, 1600m) winner I Am A Star (I Am Invincible), who is out of the unraced Star Band (Dixieland Band).

TOFANE ENDS 13-YEAR WAIT FOR NEW ZEALAND-BRED WINNER OF STRADBROKE

ofane (Ocean Park) broke a long drought in Brisbane's greatest race, Saturday's Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m), barnstorming her way down the middle of the Eagle Farm straight to add a second Group 1 win to her fine career of six wins (four stakes) and take her earnings to well beyond \$2 million.

Thirteen years have elapsed since a Kiwibred won the famous race. In 2008 the race went to Mr Baritone (Stravinsky) but we need to go back 36 years, to 1985, to find the last New Zealand-bred mare to bag the Group 1 sprint.

That was Canterbury Belle (Beaufort Sea), a wonderful racemare who remains a legend in the South Island, where she was foaled. Appropriately, she took out the 1984 New Zealand One Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) at Riccarton (in Canterbury, naturally), one of her ten wins, of which eight were stakes races.

Her name is preserved at Riccarton via a Listed race named in her honour.

That same year, the 1984 New Zealand Two Thousand Guineas (Gr.1, 1600m) went the way of Kingdom Bay (Otehi Bay) and it was these two that fought out the finish of the 1985 Stradbroke Handicap with the mare victorious.

But for a vote among the owners, Tofane might never have accepted for the race. She was catalogued to be sold at last month's Magic Millions Broodmare sale but a majority favoured racing versus selling.

Her dam, Baggy Green (Galileo), was offered for sale as a supplementary lot in the June 2013 Inglis Australian Weanling and Broodmare Sale and at that time her page revealed there were three stakes winners within her first four generations.

In a mere three seasons the family has added Baggy Green's half-sister, 2018 Queensland

Oaks (Gr 1, 2200m) victress Youngstar (High Chaparral), her three-quarter sister Funstar (Adelaide), winner of the 2019 Flight Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) and, of course her daughter Tofane, now a dual Group 1 victress, having also scored the All Aged Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Randwick last season.

Why Baggy Green?

Tofane

Exactly what was Curraghmore's Gordon Cunningham's thought process on June 25 2013 when he decided to outlay \$23,000 for the mare?

As a supplementary Lot 412 at the June 2013 sale, he was presented with a winning Galileo (Sadler's Wells) mare. She was being offered as a maiden mare, breeding-wise.

Coolmore sold Baggy Green at the 2010 Easter Yearling Sale where she realised \$130,000. She won at her second start at Goulburn but showed little in ten starts after that. She was the first foal of her dam Starspangled (Danehill), who also managed just one win in Ireland.

Unlike in Europe, where he has no peer, Galileo's record in Australia can only be described as moderately successful, and he certainly fell into that category at the time of Baggy Green's second appearance at an auction, in 2013.

Her page was interesting regarding her bloodlines, and she gained extra credits for being out of a Danehill (Danzig) mare.

Her second dam, User Friendly (Slip Anchor), however, was a standout on the track, especially at three when she arrived at Longchamp for the 1992 edition of the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m), unbeaten in her first six starts.

A maiden win over a mile and a quarter at Sandown was her debut then it was on to Lingfield and a win in the Oaks Trial (Listed, 1m2.5f). Her next four starts, all Group 1s, saw her maintain her unbeaten record.

At Epsom in The Oaks (Gr 1, 1m4f) at Epsom, she was, surprisingly, only third

favourite in a small field of seven. She took over the lead three furlongs out and was untroubled at the post, increasing her lead with every stride and ahead by three and half lengths.

There was some discussion that User Friendly's next race might be to tackle the boys in the Irish Derby (Gr 1, 1m4f) but ultimately she lined up in the Irish Oaks (Gr 1, 1m4f) and won the Yorkshire Oaks (Gr 1, 1m4f) and St Leger (Gr 1, 1m6.5f), with connections having paid a late entry fee. Accelerating quickly at the two furlong mark, she had the race sewn up soon after and was three and half lengths clear at the line.

The Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe resulted in the filly's first defeat yet she ran right up to her best form, taking the lead soon after they straightened for the run home and gave her all only to lose by a neck. Her final start for that year was to run sixth in the Japan Cup (Gr 1, 2400m).

She would return to training at four to claim another Group 1, in France, the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud (Gr 1, 2400m) and had a second attempt at the Arc. A shadow of her three-year-old self, she would finish among the tailenders, the race won by Urban Sea (Miswaki), dam of Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 1m4f) champions Galileo and Sea The Stars (Cape Cross).

Baggy Green's fifth dam is Red Poppy (Rockefella), a sister to Yorkshire Oaks winner and Epsom Oaks second West Side Story. West Side Story's daughter Super Show (Great Nephew) was exported to New Zealand where she produced Waverley Star (Star Way) whose claim to fame was in defeat, at the hands of Bonecrusher (Pag Asa) in "The Race of the Century", the 1986 Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m).

Super Show's granddaughter Sister Moonshine (Godswalk) foaled the very smart filly Moonshine (Sound Reason) who bagged two Group 1s, the Ellerslie Sires' Produce Stakes and the Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes, both over 1400 metres.

West Side Story's granddaughter Musing (Music Maestro) produced Kelt Capital Stakes (Gr 1, 2040m) winner Balmuse (Lord Ballina), a million-dollar earner who won a total of 15 races including six stakes.

After the sale Cunningham sent Baggy Green to Pierro (Lonhro) then to New Zealand. Her second mating, with Ocean Park (Thorn Park), resulted in Tofane.

As a foal Cunningham was taken with the filly early on. "Whilst we included her in our entries for Karaka for the yearling sales, I felt in my own mind there was a fair chance I would retain her," he said. "I loved the make-up of her pedigree on her dam line, but also Ocean Park was a superbly bred horse. Each year I keep at least one filly and she was a filly I kept by choice rather than one that was unwanted."

An impressive early-season trial win at three sparked several offers, including two from Sydney. "Of course, I am a horse trader, and I had a good sized offer from two leading stables in Sydney," said Cunningham. As the filly won her trial from Mike Moroney's Ballymore Stable he was keen to give the stable first option and she was sent to Moroney's Melbourne establishment.

Curraghmore's reputation as a preparer and vendor is well known and admired. Selecting Baggy Green and purchasing her for \$23,000 now looks like a masterstroke, one of the great steals, but merely underlines Cunningham's talent.

Timing is everything

His being a trader led to selling the mare to Kevin Hickman of Valachi Downs in 2017. Timing is everything and Cunningham's loss became Valachi Downs' gain.

Kiwi Chronicles contacted Gareth Downey, Valachi Downs' general manager regarding the mare's status. "Whilst we were delighted that she foaled a full sister to Tofane this season, it was bitterly disappointing that we weren't able to get her in foal. She went initially to Savabeel and then swapped to Ocean Park and despite being served on multiple occasions by Ocean Park, she didn't get in foal.

"We are, of course, desperately hoping that we can get another few fillies out of her before the end of her breeding career, as it is obviously a family we are very eager to develop further at the stud.

"None of the Youngstar, Funstar and Tofane trio had even raced by then, so nobody had any idea what was ahead of the mare at that time. It has been an amazing explosion of Group 1 Australian form since then. "Being by Galileo, and a granddaughter of such an amazing racehorse as User Friendly, was enough for her to appeal strongly to Kevin. She was just a mare at the time who needed something to happen up close in the family.

"Baggy Green has proven to be an amazing success story for Valachi, and we are privileged to have her in our broodmare band," Downey ended.

Price on the money

Let's rewind a month. Ayrton (Iffraaj) was cooling down from another impressive victory, to remain unbeaten in three starts including two sprints at Caulfield. His trainer Mick Price had this to say: "I still say that 1200 metres, when you look back on his form when he gets a bit older, it will not be his best distance," Price said. "He's got a bit to learn but I think 1400 metres and a mile will be good."

The mile was perfect and Ayrton showed his class (and proved his trainer's belief) with a dominant win over the trip in the Gunsynd Classic (G 3, 1600m) at Eagle Farm on Saturday.

Further proof is the three-year-old's winning time of 1:34.95, almost a second faster than the 1:35.86 by Converge (Frankel) in the J J Atkins Plate (Gr 1, 1600m) and almost a second and a half faster than the 1:36.43 by Ranier (Lonhro) in the Wayne Wilson Plate (Listed, 1600m), run immediately prior to the Gunsynd Classic.

After Saturday's cruise, Price added that Ayrton might see out 2000 metres later in his career: "Somewhere between a mile and 2000 metres, I'm not sure past that, we'll find that out," Price said.

"He's got a good set of lungs, he's got a good turn of foot for a mile and in this mile race here, we saw him travel strongly. He's never travelled strongly because he doesn't quite get it yet. But he's getting there and I think a mile is beautiful."

One race that is on the cards is the rich Golden Eagle over 1500 metres this coming spring. "After this I would love to put a circle around the best return to the owners, which would be the Golden Eagle. I think that would be the best race for him. But that's to be discussed, and we'll have a think about it," said Price.

Ayrton was withdrawn from the 2019 NZB

Karaka Ready To Run Sale. His dam Odessa (Falkirk) never raced but at stud is two for two from her only named foals. She is a half-sister to Eulogy Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) winner Monterey Bay (Kaapstad).

Odessa's dam, Sabbatical (Bakharoff) was a Listed winner of four races including the Canterbury Belle Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Riccarton while her granddam was the very speedy Secunda (Acidity). Secunda's six wins included three stakes as a two-year-old, her premier performance being Caulfield's Debutante Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m).

Secunda's fourth dam was Sweet Nymph (Neptune), also the fourth dam of the brilliant Dulcify (Decies).

Two down, one to go

Ayrton's sire Iffraaj (Zafonic) has certainly left his mark in both hemispheres. His first shuttle season to Haunui Farm was in 2008, faithfully returning for the next eleven seasons and the industry is all the better for his prior annual holidays to New Zealand.

At the most recent Karaka Yearling Sale, Iffraaj was not only represented by his penultimate southern hemisphere crop, but also his sons Turn Me Loose and Ribchester, plus his grandson, Almanzor, were also represented, the latter making a huge impression with buyers.

Windsor Park Stud's Turn Me Loose is on his way with his first crop, siring the unbeaten Turn The Ace, a Listed winner at his second start last month.

He is one of three stallions that In 2017 Windsor Park Stud had the unenviable task of promoting, with Vanbrugh (Encosta De Lago) and Rageese (Street Cry) joining the NZ 2,000

Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner. That was a tough ask and the numbers reflect just how tough.

Turn Me Loose attracted a solid 145 mares while Vanbrugh and Rageese wound up with 55 and 56 mares respectively.

One of Vanbrugh's 36 first crop foals, Mustang Valley, gave her sire and Windsor Park Stud a nice boost at Te Rapa on Saturday. The filly, having just her third start, had her race under control from the 200 metres and will now head for a break.

From the Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman stable, she can be expected to be seen again in the spring with Forsman adding: "She has a big, strong action and is quite physically mature for her age, but when she does strengthen up fully, she will be a very handy horse."

Windsor Park Stud's Rodney Schick was delighted to see Vanbrugh get off the mark.

> "It is fantastic to get a two-year-old winner for Vanbrugh," he said. "He won his two-yearold debut at Randwick and then went on to be a three-year-old Group 1 winner, so he was a genuinely classy individual.

"It would be fair to say that he hasn't really had the numbers we were hoping for in his first couple of seasons at stud, but there is some nice word on the ones he has in work and to see a quality filly like this come through can only be good for him."

Of the three, Turn Me Loose and Vanbrugh are off and running with winners at the races which only leaves Rageese to chime in. He has had a few runners including two trial winners, so it is merely a matter of time.

Bread and butter anyone?

Niagara (Encosta De Lago), based at The Oaks Stud in Cambridge, is doing his job very well of late. In the past month the stallion has sired thirteen individual winners, including Jaguary, a back-to-back winner at Morphettville last Saturday.

Jaguary was one of four winners for Niagara on Saturday, the others being Falls (at Sandown), Nedwin (at Trentham) and Skagerak (Gold Coast) with Capital Gains breaking his maiden on Sunday at Timaru.

Taranaki's Thursday meeting resulted in a winning double (Jane O' and Dame Vera) and the day before that his Sky Gem scored at Happy Valley in Hong Kong.

Another recent winner is the formerly New Zealand-trained Chuck A Luck who was Groupplaced here. He took out the Mornington Guineas (1600m) at his second Australian start in March 2020 and on May 23, in a midweek Sandown handicap, he secured his third career win

Chin going for Gold in Guineas

tanley Chin has confirmed a Macau Guineas (Listed, 1500m) start for his exciting sand galloper City Gold (Outstrip) after another dominant win in Friday night's Class 2 over 1510 metres on the all-weather surface.

Ridden by regular jockey Masa Tanaka, City Gold again led throughout for an easy win over Tremendous Wins (Turffontein), with Treasurelakebuddy (Snitzel) in third.

City Gold has now won five races from his last six runs on the sand, and has been very dominant in his last four victories. The four-year-old's record now reads 12 starts for six wins, two seconds and one third, with all his victories coming on the all-weather surface.

However, that is not stopping Chin from having a tilt at the Guineas, with the 1800 metres of the Derby in mind.

"Yes, he will run in the Guineas if all is well with him. He deserves his chance, and after this win he is now the second highest-rated four-year-old here." Chin said.

City Gold's only run on the turf was at his second start in July last season when he finished sixth, beaten ten lengths, behind his stablemate Cherry Road (Niagara). He was still very immature at the time, and after two more runs Chin gave the gelding a rest before he started his winning run on the first day of the new season at the end of September.

On breeding, one would think that the turf should not be a problem for City Gold. He is by Outstrip (Exceed And Excel), who was a winner of the 2013 Champagne Stakes (Gr 2, 7f) at Doncaster and the 2013 Breeders Cup Turf (Gr 1, 8f) at Santa Anita Park.

His dam, Mudammera (Dubawi), was a non-winner in her four starts, but is by Dubawi (Dubai Millennium), who was a winner of the National Stakes (Gr 1, 7f) as well as the Irish 2000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m) at the Curragh.



City Gold

Chin purchased City Gold purely by chance, when he was at the yard of Newmarket trainer Stuart Williams.

"I had bought The Whirlwind (Ex Global Explorer) off Stuart; he was a very good Class 1 horse for me here in Macau. I was at his yard one day looking at horses and he suggested I take a look at City Gold who was unraced, but he said that he had worked well alongside a couple of his nice horses."

"I liked what I saw, and he was fairly priced, so I decided to take a chance on him." Chin added.

It was a wise decision by Chin, with City Gold's six wins reaping over \$1million HKD for owners Chang Kwok Yin & Kwan Yiu Pang so far, with plenty still ahead of him.

As it stands, Chin's main Derby (Listed, 1800m) hope is Beauty Bolt (Redoute's Choice), who performed well at Group level in Australia, including a fourth place in the VRC Oaks (Gr 1, 2500m) at Flemington. That said, City Gold can do no more than he has to date, and the 1800 metres of the SJM Derby does look tailormade for him, should he prove adaptable to the turf.

Cheung bounces back with four

Eric Cheung has shown he is not going down without a fight in his quest for the Jockeys' Championship by booting home four winners over the weekend's racing to take him within ten wins of premiership leader Luis Corrales.

Cheung, after going winless the week prior, was in fine form for the weekend and opened his account with a win on the Victor Chantrained Pride Sprint (Makfi), in the Class 5 & 6 over 1510 metres on Friday night.

The win gave Cheung his 105th race winner, therefore losing his three pounds claim, at the end of Friday night's racing.

The former Hong Kong reject City Lucky Star (Redoute's Choice) made three wins from three starts in Macau when he dug deep under Cheung, after a wide trip, to get up in the last few strides to beat the stablemate Hostwin Prosperits (Redwood), in the Class 4 over 1510 metres.

Prepared by Tony Fung, City Lucky Star is nicely bred, being by Redoute's Choice (Danehill)

out of Fashion Note (Singspiel). An AU\$90,000 purchase at the 2017 Inglis Easter Yearling Sale, the colt trialed twice in country New South Wales at Tamworth and Quirindi, managing a second place at the latter.

His time in Hong Kong though was unremarkable, with 11 starts and no placings. He did, however, manage to get within three and a quarter lengths of them in Class 5 over 1650 metres, on the all-weather track at Sha Tin. Now a five-year-old, City Lucky Star has strengthened up and, evidenced by Saturday's win, will have no problems handling the rise to Class 3.

On Saturday, Cheung was quick to strike again with a win in race two for trainer Geoff Allendorf on Global Justice (Declaration Of War), in the Class 3 & 4 over 1500 metres, giving the gelding back-to-back wins.

Last year's Derby winner Sacred Magnate (Foxwedge) rounded out Cheung's weekend with a win on the Joe Lau-trained galloper in the Class 1 & 2 over 1500 metres.

Sacred Magnate was coming off a narrow defeat at the unsuitable 1200 metres behind Crispy Biscuit (Written Tycoon) and had been a certainty when second behind Top Mountainlegend (Manhattan Rain) back in April over 1500 metres, after running into traffic in the straight and not finding clear running until the race was all over.

Saturday's race was run in a downpour with the heavens opening up as the field broke from the gates, however there were no concerns in the run with Cheung putting the son of Foxwedge (Fastnet Rock) into a perfect spot in fourth, one out and one back, before bursting down the centre of the track to hit the lead at the 150-metre mark. Whilst not completely at home in the wet conditions, his class got him through to beat Mountain Tiger (Coats Choice), with Top Mountainlegend (Manhattan Rain) in third.

With Corrales coming off a fantastic 22-win spree in two months to set up a commanding lead, Cheung will need nothing short of a miracle to reel him in, That said, Corrales went winless for the weekend, so if Cheung could produce another couple of big days he could stay in the race.

As it stands, Corrales is in a very enviable position, with a ten-win lead and just 16 race days to go before the end of the season.

Smith's Arrow looks Smart

The successful combination of Wayne Smith and Shogo Nakano were back in the winner's circle Saturday with the promising Smart Arrow (Smart Missile) in the Class 4 over 1200 metres.

Having his first run for Smith, Smart Arrow was given a gem of a ride by Nakano midfield against the rail, before weaving between runners and bursting out of the pack late to win handsomely.

Smart Arrow, a nice-looking son of Smart Missile (Fastnet Rock), got

home over the top of the speedy Small Waterfall (Ocean Park), with Sport General (Toronado) in third.

Smart Arrow was formerly with Tony Fung and had won two on the sand from his first three runs in the enclave before going amiss. The gelding would often get very worked up prior to his races, and proved costly for punters on a few occasions after being sent out as favourite.

"He came to me at the end of April after he was beaten on the sand. He did have some soreness issues in front, so it took a little while to get him right." Smith said.

"I took the blinkers off and put a hood on him for trackwork. I ride a lot of my own work so I was able to put in plenty of time riding him myself. He has not put a foot wrong and has turned into an absolute gentleman in trackwork.

"He was even perfect at the gates when we gave him a jump-out ten days back, and that used to be a big problem for him."

It was a much more laidback Smart Arrow on Saturday with blinkers off and sporting side winkers for the first time. He relaxed in the run and found the line strongly.

Ridden by Andrea Atzeni, the three-year-old was winning for the fifth time in just nine starts as he beat Warrior Brave (Twilight Son) by three-quarters of a length. Steel Bull (Clodovil) was a further two and a half lengths away in third. Cable Bay stood the 2021 northern hemisphere season at Highclere Stud for a fee of £8,000 (approx. AUD\$14,600).

Caravaggio - Coolmore's Caravaggio (Scat Daddy) sired his eighth individual winner when Silver Surfer (2 c ex Riskit Fora Biskit by Kodiac) struck in the opening maiden over six furlongs at Fairyhouse on Friday. Trained by Donnacha O'Brien, the colt was racing for the fifth time as he beat Shoebox King (Aclaim) by half a length with Schiele (Dark Angel) the same margin away in third. The fourth foal out of the Listed winner Riskit Fora Biskit (Kodiac), Silver Surfer was a 100,000 gns buy out of the Tattersalls Book 1 sale. Caravaggio, who shuttled to Coolmore

Australia for one season in 2018, resides at Coolmore's Ashford Stud in Kentucky for a fee of \$25,000 (approx. AUD\$32,470).

Defcon - Defcon (Choisir) landed a third winner from just his tenth runner when Conismo (2 g ex Amaranda by Fasliyev) scored at the Gold Coast on Saturday. The Jake Capewell-trained gelding ran out a comfortable length-winner of the QTIS 2YO Maiden Plate (1300m) at his fourth start, defeating Winter Violet (Not A Single Doubt) by a length. His dam, Amaranda (Fasliyev), was raced by Coolmore in Ireland, yielding one win on the track, and is a half-sister to Mowen (Motivator), the dam of Japanese star three-year-old Titleholder (Duramente). Conismo is her fifth named foal and fourth winner. Group 3 winner Defcon stood his first four seasons at Eureka Stud, however fertility issues which saw him produce just 86 live foals in that period led to his recent sale for \$17,000 to Boyne River Thoroughbreds, where he now stands.

Flying Artie - Newgate Farm's Flying Artie (Artie Schiller) added a ninth winner from his first crop courtesy of the highly thought of Almighty Rising (2 g ex Dawn Almighty by

Danehill), who won a close finish at Canterbury on Wednesday, defeating Celtic Harp (No Nay Never) by a nose in the 1100-metre twoyear-old handicap. Trained by Team Hawkes, Almighty Rising contested the Blue Diamond Prelude (Group 3, 1100m) on debut, finishing at the tail of the 11-runner field having led them up to the 400-metre mark, but co-trainer Michael Hawkes said the fact he debuted in the Prelude was an indication of the ability of the Almighty Rising. "Obviously in Melbourne, Wayne had a bit of an opinion of this horse and we put him in the deep end and it just didn't come to hand that day," he said. "He went to the paddock, we gelded him and tried to make a racehorse of him. He's still wanting to learn a bit. He's still running around a little bit in the straight but when he gets his mind to it and gets his mind on the job, I think he's going to be a nice horse." Having passed in as a yearling he was retained to race by Newgate Farm, along with partners Horse Ventures and WinStar Farm. Out of Dawn Almighty (Danehill), Almighty Rising is a half-brother to New Zealand Group 1 winner Ruud Awakening (Bernardini). Flying Artie will stand the 2021 season at Newgate Farm for a fee of \$33,000 (inc. GST).

Maurice - Maurice (Screen Hero) sired his sixth individual winner from his first Australian crop when Sharp Response (2 g ex Marli Magic by Host) got off the mark on his racecourse debut with a victory in a two-year-old maiden over 1108 metres at Sale on Wednesday. The Julius Sandhu-trained gelding scored by a head under Beau Mertens with Tranquil Bay (Cable Bay) filling second spot. The Art Of Flying (Flying Artie) finished a length behind the winner in third. "He was a nice-looking horse and he went a little cheaper than I thought as he had some growing to do," Sandhu said of the \$70,000 buy out of the Flinders Park Stud draft at the 2020 Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale. "He was not very big at the time. We gelded him and he grew a bit and I think if we turn him out, he will grow even more and furnish into a nice horse. The one thing about

him is he's very athletic and a very sound horse. He does a lot right at home. He doesn't act up a lot and is very professional on the track. It will be nice if he goes home, eats up and then we'll have the hard decision to make, but it's a good problem to have." Sharp Response is the second foal and first winner out of the Host (Hussonet) mare Marli Magic, herself the winner of five of her 30 starts. Maurice will be back at Arrowfield in 2021 for a fee of \$44,000.

Territories - Darley shuttler Territories (Invincible Spirit) sired his first southern hemisphere-bred winner when Finsceal (2 g ex Rosalita by Danehill Dancer) scored at the Sunshine Coast on Sunday. Trained by Tom Button, Finsceal (\$18) won the Canadian Club QTIS 2YO Handicap (1200m) on debut by a nose over Hinged (Worthy Cause) (\$3 favourite) while Miss Pierro (Pierro) (\$4.40) was three lengths away in third. Finsceal was bought by Gerald O'Toole for \$110,000 from the Symphony Lodge draft at last year's Magic Millions 2YOs in Training Sale at the Gold Coast after he was initially purchased for the same price from Oaklands Stud at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale. Territories will return to Darley's Kelvinside property in NSW this year at a fee of \$11,000 (inc GST).

Vanbrugh - Windsor Park Stud-based first crop stallion Vanbrugh (Encosta De Lago), a Spring Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) winner, got off the mark on Saturday when Mustang Valley (2 f ex Cream Of The Crop by New Approach) scored a strong victory at Te Rapa. Trained by Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman, Mustang Valley had raced twice prior to landing the Skycity Hamilton 2YO 1200m) by one and three-quarter lengths over Riverplate (Flying Artie). Treasure State (Trust In A Gust) was three and three-quarter lengths back in third. Vanbrugh stands at Windsor Park Stud this year for a fee of \$5,000 (plus GST).

Winning Rupert - Runner-up to Profiteer (Capitalist) on debut in December would appear handy form, and so it proved as Ranveer (2 c ex Bitter Twist by California Dane) showed his class at his second start on Saturday to claim a comfortable victory in the 2YO Handicap (1000m) at Sandown, defeating Our Heidi (Needs Further) by three-quarters of a length. In the process, Ranveer provided his sire Winning Rupert (Written Tycoon) with a seventh individual winner. Ranveer was the second most expensive yearling at last year's Magic Millions Perth sale, selling for \$200,000 to Matt Laurie Racing, and the colt capped a

She has a yearling filly by Oratorio (Stravinsky) and a weanling colt by Press Statement (Hinchinbrook), while she was placed in foal to So You Think (High Chaparral) last year. Winning Rupert will stand this season for \$11,000 at Newgate Farm.

New Group/Grade 1 winners

Frankel - Champion racehorse Frankel (Galileo) saw his increasing global influence grow once more on Saturday, as Converge (2 g ex Conversely by Shamardal) landed a 15th worldwide Group 1 winner for the stallion, and a third in Australia just this season, with victory in the J J Atkins (Gr 1, 1600m) at Eagle Farm. The Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Botttrained gelding, who was bred and is raced by Bott's father, Tony, under his Evergreen Stud Farm banner, filled the runner's up spot in the BRC Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) a fortnight earlier, but proved far too good stepping up to the mile, a distance at which he also won the Fernhill Handicap (Listed, 1600m) at Randwick in April, before finishing third in the ATC Champagne Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) ahead of a Brisbane campaign. First season sires filled the placings, as Flying Artie's (Artie Schiller) Giannis finished three and a quarter lengths back in third, a short-head in front of Sires' Produce winner Tiger Of Malay (Extreme Choice). Converge is the first foal out of Conversely (Shamardal), a maiden in Ireland after eight starts, who was covered by Frankel prior to her export to Australia after being purchased for €6,000 at the Goffs February sale in 2017. Her Churchill (Galileo) yearling colt sold for \$28,000 as a weanling to Raphe Bloodstock, while she has a weanling colt by Invader (Snitzel) and was placed in foal

to Divine Prophet (Choisir) last year. Frankel stands at Juddmonte Farms in Newmarket for a fee of £175,000 (approx. AUD\$320,300).

New stakes winners

Bodemeister - A shock ensued in the Salvator Mile Stakes (Gr 3, 8f) at Monmouth Park on Saturday, as Informative (4 h ex Lucky Black by Hard Spun) notched a first stakes win at his 25th start when sent off a 79-1 chance. Previously stakes placed, Informative became the 22nd individual stakes winner for his sire Bodemeister (Empire Maker) as he defeated odds-on favourite Ny Traffic (Cross Traffic) by a length, with Galerio (Jump Start) a further one and a half lengths adrift in third. Bodemeister now stands at the Jockey Club in Turkey, where he commands a fee of €12,500 (approx. AUD\$19,600).

Cable Bay - After landing his maiden recently at the Sunshine Coast, becoming the fourth individual winner in Australia for his sire Cable Bay (Invincible Spirit), the Steven O'Dea and Matthew Hoysted-trained Uncommon James (2 c ex Pickabee by Jet Spur) became the first stakes winner for the former Woodside Park shuttler with victory in the Oxlade Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Eagle Farm on Saturday. Uncommon James ran down favourite and runaway race leader Maotai (Not A Single Doubt) in the final strides, winning by a quarter of a length. King High (Not A Single Doubt) held on for third, two and a half lengths behind the winner. Uncommon James is the second living foal out of the stakes placed Pickabee (Jet Spur). She has a weanling filly by Capitalist (Written Tycoon) and was placed in foal to Yes Yes Yes (Rubick) last year. Cable Bay is the sire of five stakes winners overall, including Group 2-winning sprinter Liberty Beach. He stood the 2021 northern hemisphere season at Highclere Stud for a fee of £8,000 (approx. AUD\$14,600)

Dubawi - Jean-Claude Rouget took Longchamp's Prix Volterra (Listed, 1600m) wth Haras de Saint Pair homebred Valloria (3 f ex Celebre Vadala by Peintre Celebre) who became the 207th individual stakes winner - and second this week about Creative Flair (3 f ex Hidden Gold by Shamardal) took the Abingdon Stakes (Listed, 1m 2f) at Newbury on Thursday - for her sire Dubawi (Dubai Millennium). Ridden by Cristian Demuro, she was keen early on and pulled herself to the front before picking up smartly to win cosily by three quarters of a length from the evens favourite Dolia (Invincible Spirit) and they were a further

length and a half clear of Complication (No Nay Never) in third. Valloria is the 20th stakes winner this season for Dubawi who stands at Darley's Dalham Hall in Newmarket for £250,000 (approx. AUD\$457,725).

Galileo - Coolmore's super sire Galileo (Sadler's Wells) sired his 337th individual stakes winner when Roberto Escobarr (4 c ex Bewitched by Dansili) obliged as favourite in the Sky Bet Race To The Ebor Grand Cup Stakes (Listed, 1m 6f) at York on Saturday. Ridden by Tom Marquand for William Haggas, the fouryear-old beat Red Verdon (Lemon Drop Kid) by a length and a half. Makawee (Farhh) was another length and a quarter away in third. Roberto Escobarr has now won three times in five starts. A €145,000 buy from Goffs in 2018, he was bred by Bob Scarborough and is the fifth foal out of the Dansili (Danehill) mare Bewitched. His year older brother Pablo Escobarr is a Group 3 winner, as was the dam herself. Galileo once again stands for an undisclosed fee at Coolmore Ireland.

Iffraaj - Ayrton (3 g ex Odessa by Falkirk) bounced back emphatically from his shock Fred Best Classic (Gr 3, 1400m) defeat a fortnight earlier to land the Gunsynd Classic (Gr 3, 1600m) at Eagle Farm on Saturday by a rousing two and three-quarter lengths. Ayrton, making his fourth start, became the 80th individual stakes winner for his sire Iffraaj (Zafonic), when defeating Ellsberg (Spill The Beans) and Mob Buster (Spill The Beans), who was four and a half lengths behind the winner. The Mick Price and Michael Kent jr-trained Ayrton, who passed in as a yearling, is the penultimate foal for his dam, Odessa (Falkirk), who died in 2019. She has a two-year-old colt by Sweynesse (Lonhro). Iffraaj, who shuttled to Haunui Farm from 2008

to 2019, now has 29 southern hemisphere stakes winners, including Group 1 winners Turn Me Loose, Jon Snow, Gingernuts and Wyndspelle. His place on the New Zealand stud roster has been filled by his son Ribchester, who has three winners from his first northern hemisphere two-year-olds. Iffraaj now permanently resides at Darley's Dalham Hall Stud, where he stood 2021 for a fee of £20,00 (approx. AUD\$36,600).

Lope De Vega - General De Vega (4 h ex Just Little by Grandslam) became the 82nd individual stakes winner for former Australian shuttle stallion Lope De Vega (Shamardal) when he won the Bro Park Varsprint (Listed, 1200m) in Sweden on Sunday. General De Vega defeated Could Be King (Bated Breath) and Dardenne (Footstepsinthesand) to record a fourth win from eight starts. His dam, Just Little (Grandslam), was bred by Jean Dubois and General De Vega becomes the third stakes winner for his dam, after the Matthew Smithtrained Radipole (Rock Of Gibraltar), a stakes winner in France before his export to Australia, and Prix de Suresnes (Listed, 2000m) winner Naturally High (Camelot). Lope De Vega stands at Ballylinch Stud for a fee of €125,000 (approx. AUD\$196,000).

Medaglia d'Oro - Five-year-old mare Adelong (5 m ex Snowgums by Redoute's Choice) continued her late blooming, winning for the eighth time in 17 starts and a first at stakes level, after she claimed the Bob Charley AO Stakes (Listed, 1100m) at Randwick on Saturday for trainer Brad Widdup. The daughter of Medaglia D'Oro (El Prado) became the 152nd individual stakes winner for her sire, and 29th southern hemisphere-bred stakes winner. After defeating Wandabaa (Wandjina) at Randwick a fortnight earlier, she again beat that same rival on Saturday, this time by a quarter of a length. Topweight Viridine (Poet's Voice) filled third, a length and a half behind the winner. Adelong, one of three named foals for the deceased Snowgums (Redoute's Choice), did not start racing until a four-year-old, winning six of her eight starts that season. Medaglia D'Oro, who shuttled to Darley's Kelvinside property until 2017, now permanently resides at Jonabell Farm in Kentucky for a fee of \$150,000 (approx. AUD\$194,600).

A three-time winner last term, including the valuable Weatherbys Racing Bank 2YO Stakes, he disappointed on his last run in the Mill Reef Stakes (Gr 3, 6.5f) however that was his seventh run of the season and he looks a sprinter to follow. Ridden by David Egan, the three-year-old was held up, took a gap up the rail and stuck to the task to win by two and a quarter lengths from the favourite Khaadem (Dark Angel), while Cairn Gorm (Bated Breath) was a further two lengths back in third. Line Of Departure was a £260,000 Goffs UK Premier Sale yearling and he is a half-brother to Group 1-winning sprinter Golden Horde (Lethal Force) and stakes winner Exhort (Dutch Art) and is from the family of US Champion Serena's Song (Rahy). Mehmas stands at Tally-Ho Stud in Ireland for a fee of €25,000 (approx. AUD\$39,290).

Olympic Glory - Runner-up on her two previous starts in May this year, Jannah Flower (3 f ex Azafata by Motivator) stepped up to Listed company in the Prix Melisande (Listed, 2100m) at Longchamp on Sunday for Pascal Bary and broke her maiden to become the ninth individual stakes winner for former Arrowfield shuttler Olympic Glory (Choisir), following Mintd's (5 m ex Lisanor by Raven's Pass) victory in the US on Saturday. Ridden by Stephane Pasquier, Jannah Flower was held up, weaved a passage and flew home, seeing off the challenge of Vrigny (Le Havre) by a head, while Crohanne (Havana Gold) was a further length and a quarter back in third. Jannah Flower was a €400,000 Arqana yearling purchase and is out of the Spanish Champion three-year-old filly Azafata (Motivator) who is also responsible for the Group 2 winner and Irish Oaks (Gr 1, 1m 4f) runner-up Fleeting (Zoffany). Olympic Glory stands at

Al Shaqab's Haras de Bouquetot in France for a fee of €5,000 (approx. AUD\$7,850).

Reliable Man - Runner-up in the 2019 Preis Der Diana (Gr 1, 2400m), the talented Naida (5 m ex Nacella by Banyumanik) made a belated breakthrough at stakes level, earning blacktype success at her 13th attempt, and did so emphatic fashion, as she surged clear in the closing stages at Cologne to win the Steher Cup (Listed, 3000m). Ida Alata (Adlerflug) finished second, with Memphis (Jukebox Jury) finishing third. In the process, the grey became the 16th individual winner for her sire Reliable Man (Dalakhani). Out of the stakes placed Nacella (Banyumanik), she is a half-sister to stakes winner Nacida (Wiener Walzer) and the stakes placed Nacar (Tertullian). Reliable Man will once again shuttle to Westbury Stud in New Zealand this year, where he will stand for an increased fee of \$17,500 + GST.

Verrazano - Superium (4 g ex Rosie's Halo by Al Maher), runner-up in the Up And Coming Stakes (Gr 3, 1300m) as a two-yearold and Wellington Boot (1100m) winner as a juvenile, landed a first stakes win as a fouryear-old when taking out the Hinkler Handicap (Listed, 1200m) at Eagle Farm on Saturday. The gelding had been absent from the winner's enclosure since December 2019, when beating subsequent stakes winners Embracer (Sebring) and Splintex (Snitzel) at Randwick, and caused a shock when finishing a length ahead of Southern Lad (Ocean Park) and Magic Millions 2YO Classic winner Away Game (Snitzel), making her first start since February. Superium became the tenth individual stakes winner for his sire Verrazano (More Than Ready), and second from his one and only southern hemisphere bred crop which produced 49 live foals, the other being Listed-winning two-year-old Mockery. Superium was bred by Superhorse and retained to race by the owner-breeder operation having passed in as a yearling. The Team Hawkes-trained gelding is the fifth named foal out of Rosie's Halo (Al Maher), whose yearling filly by Rubick (Encosta De Lago) sold for \$125,00 to Star Thoroughbreds at the Inglis Classic Yearling Sale this year. Verrazano has since shuttled to Haras Paso Nevado in Chile.


